CAREGIVERS COURSE FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZENS ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Minimum education required - Class VIII pass.

Admission

Trainees need to appear for a written test and an interview.

Evaluation

The examination committee will conduct an assessment before distribution of certificate

- Personnel to acquire knowledge, competencies and skills for providing support to persons with disabilities and senior citizens

Program Structure

Theoretical and practical classes will be held at IICP 5 days a week- 240 hours over 60 working days. Sessions will be held by professionals from both internal and external faculty. The course will also include field visits to other organizations and residential services
