VACANCY CIRCULAR

It is proposed to fill up 02 (anticipated) vacancies in the below-mentioned rank in Intelligence Bureau under the Ministry of Home Affairs on deputation/re-employment basis except for IPS officers. The educational qualification, experience and other eligibility conditions for the post are furnished below. The Pay Scale and the qualifying service rendered may be read corresponding to the respective Level in Pay Matrix as per 7th Central Pay Commission.

2. Deputy Director/Executive (02 vacancies-anticipated), General Central Service (Group 'A'), Gazetted Non-Ministerial, Level 13A (Rs. 1,31,100 - Rs. 2,16,600) in the Pay Matrix as per 7th CPC: Eligibility for deputation

(A) Officer of Central Government or State Governments or Union Territories including All India Services other than Indian Police Service:-

- (i) holding analogous post on regular basis in the parent cadre or department; or
- (ii) with two years' service in the grade rendered after appointment thereto on regular basis in the post in Level 13 (Rs. 1,23,100 - 2,15,900) in the pay matrix or equivalent in the parent cadre or department; if Level 13A (Rs. 1,31,100 - 2,16,600) in the pay matrix or equivalent is not available in the service or cadre; or

(B) Officer of the rank of Brigadier in Level 13A (Rs. 1,39,600 - 2,17,600) in the pay matrix in the Army or of equivalent rank from other wings of the Defence Forces; or

(C) For Ex-Servicemen (Deputation/ Re-employment): The Armed Forces personnel of the rank of Brigadier in Level 13A (Rs. 1,39,600 - 2,17,600) in the pay matrix in the Army or of equivalent rank from other wings of the defence forces who are due to retire or to be transferred to reserve within a period of one year, shall also be considered. If selected, such officers will be given deputation terms up to the date on which they are due for release from the Armed Forces; thereafter they may be continued on re-employment; AND

(D) Possessing the following educational qualifications and experience, namely:

- (i) Bachelor's degree from a recognized university or institute;
- (ii) five years' experience in the field of intelligence work/counter intelligence/counter terrorism/counter espionage.

Note 1 : The departmental officers in the feeder category who are in the direct line of promotion will not be eligible for consideration for appointment on deputation. Similarly, deputationists will not be eligible for consideration for appointment by promotion.

Note 2 : The period of deputation including period of deputation in another ex-cadre posts held immediately preceding this appointment in the same or some other organization or department of the Central Government shall ordinarily not exceed five years.

Note 3: The maximum age limit for appointment by deputation shall be not exceeding 56 years as on the closing date of the receipt of application.

3. The application of willing and eligible officers, complete in all respects, may be forwarded with the following documents so as to reach the Joint Deputy Director/G-3, Intelligence Bureau, Ministry of Home Affairs, 35 S P Marg, Bapu Dham, New Delhi-110021 on or before 24th May, 2024.

- (i) Bio-data duly filled and signed by the candidate and forwarded through proper channel (i.e. along with NOC of parent department/cadre);
- (ii) Copies of the updated ACRs/APARs for last five years attested by lending department;
- (iii) Vigilance Clearance and Integrity Certificate including a statement of major/minor penalties, if any, imposed on the officer during the last 10 years.

4. Applications received without proper channel or advance copy or after closing date or incomplete (without all or any of the above enclosures) will not be considered and no correspondence will be made or entertained in this regard. The officers, once applied for the post, will not be allowed to withdraw their candidature subsequently. Applicants should not have undergone two previous deputations. Apart from pay and allowances, a Special Security Allowance @20% and other perks attached with the post will be admissible.

5. The officer inducted/selected to this post will be on deputation for a period as specified in RRs/induction order. This period can be curtailed or extended if exigencies of service so require. The deputation as well as eligibility of the officer would be governed in terms of DoP&T OM No. AB 14017/71/89-Estt (RR) dt. 3.10.89, No. 6/8/2009-Estt. (Pay II) dt. 17.6.10 and as amended from time to time. The terms and conditions as mentioned in RRs and elaborated above need to be read with the DoP&T's guidelines on deputation re-employment.

- b) Footwear for very small children of age group of 2-4 years;
- c) Footwear for population living in rural settlements (villages) having different lifestyle from those in urban areas;
- d) Footwear for members of armed forces (for example military and police staff) wearing heavy boots during their services;
- e) Footwear for physical workers requiring safety footwear/boots;
- f) Footwear for pregnant women;
- g) Footwear for workers performing their jobs in standing position during their working shifts and
- h) Footwear for local population living with diabetes that requires specially designed and manufactured footwear.

appeal. Traditionally, Uppada jamdani sarees were crafted using fine-count cotton yarn, but modern productions utilise mulberry silk in warp and weft, with silk or zari for the extra weft designs. Weaving jamdani sarees requires skilled artistry, as thick extra weft is introduced alongside thin ground picks, resulting in symmetrical designs on both sides of the saree. While the traditional Jala technique is employed, modern methods such as Jacquard weaving have become popular for their simplicity and increased productivity.

10. Kancheepuram Silk

Kancheepuram, known as the silk and temple city of Tamil Nadu, is located around 70 kilometers from Chennai. Its prominent textile is the Kancheepuram silk saree, woven on throw shuttle pit looms using the adai technique. Traditionally, two weavers collaborate to create the solid border (Korvai) and contrasting pallu using the petni technique, drawing inspiration from temple sculptures for designs. Mulberry silk yarn and gold zari, comprising silver, copper, silk and gold,



are the primary materials utilised, with a standard of two-ply silk threads in warp and three-ply in weft. These sarees are distinguished by their unique contrast border achieved through the Korvai technique and contrasting pallu using the Petni technique. Modern variations may incorporate two to three jacquards for border, body and pallu weaving, with or without the Korvai technique.
